If there are any changes to the shift hours, the COR shall provide advance notice to give the contractor sufficient time to adjust the hours. The contractor is required to provide on-call support for emergencies after hours. The contractor shall maintain sign-in/sign-out logs reflecting contractor employee's presence and deviations relative to hours of work.

1.3.4 Overtime/Extended Hours

If overtime/extended hours are authorized on this task, the contractor shall obtain authorization from the Contracting Officer Representative (COR) prior to contractor employees working overtime. Under no circumstances shall contractor employees exceed the extended hour allotment. If additional extended hours are required, the contractor shall request, in writing, through the COR that the task be amended accordingly.

1.3.5 Adherence to Government Directives and Regulations

1.3.5.1 Privacy Act Compliance

The contractor shall ensure that employees assigned to this task understand and comply with DOD Regulation 5400.7, DOD Freedom of Information Act Program and SECNAVINST 5211.5E, Department of the Navy (DON) Privacy Program. These directives set policy and procedures for the disclosure of records to the public and for making, handling, transmitting, and safeguarding For Official Use Only (FOUO) material. In addition, they set guidelines for collecting, safeguarding, maintaining, using, accessing, amending, and disseminating personal data kept in systems of records.

1.3.5.2 Rehabilitation Act of 1973 Section 508 Compliance

Exempt under Section 1194.3 of the applicable accessibility standards at 36 CFR 1194, which implements Section 508 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended.

1.4 Security and Special Instructions Specific to GTMO

1.4.1 Clearance

Contractors must be U.S. Citizens. Per SECNAV M-5510.30, duties involving the design, operation, or maintenance of intrusion detection systems deployed to safeguard DoN personnel or property, are classified as non-critical sensitive which is an IT -II and requires U.S. citizenship as a basis for employment. Access to confidential/classified areas will be required. The contractor shall be responsible to possess a National Agency Check with Local Record Check (NACLRC) or security clearance for each contractor employee representative that will perform work under this contract, to

provide for any required computer room and Building access.

Facility Access: Unescorted access to the facilities is strictly limited to Contractor personnel who have a valid contract and a favorably completed NACLIC with an Interim Secret security clearance, or a finalized Secret security clearance (or higher). NAVSTA operational sites are not staffed to provide Contractor escort; Contractor personnel credentials must support the operational site mission.

1.4.2 Entry Approval

No contractor employee or representative of the contractor will be admitted to the U.S. Naval Station, Guantanamo Bay, Cuba without prior entry approval. The background of contractor personnel will be screened prior to entry to the U.S. Naval Station, Guantanamo Bay, Cuba. The Contractor shall submit to the COR the full name, date and place of birth, and Social Security number of such persons. The COR shall receive this information 10 calendar days prior to the scheduled or desired arrival at the Naval Base. Travel to the U.S. Naval Station, Guantanamo Bay, Cuba requires a passport.

1.4.3 Workforce

The Contractor agrees to dismiss from the site, when directed by the Contracting Officer, any individual whose continued employment is deemed to be contrary to the public interest or inconsistent with the best interest of the national security.

No employee or representative of the Contractor will be admitted to the U.S. Naval Base, Guantanamo Bay, Cuba without prior entry approval. The background of Contractor personnel will be screened prior to entry to the U.S. Naval Base, Guantanamo Bay, Cuba. The Contractor shall submit to the Contracting Officer the full name, date and place of birth, and Social Security Number of such persons. This information shall be received by the Contracting Officer Representative 45 calendar days prior to the scheduled or desired arrival at the Naval Base.

Proselytizing of labor, that is, the hiring of Government or Contractor on-base employees by offering higher wages or other amenities, shall not be permitted unless a release from the employer is executed or the employee resigns and leaves the base for a minimum of 90 days.

Accordingly, labor which the Contractor proposes to use shall be approved by the Contracting

1.4.4 Identification of Contractor Employees

The Contractor shall be responsible for furnishing to each employee and for requiring each employee to display such identification as may be approved and directed by the COR. Employees may be fingerprinted prior to employment as a condition of entry onto the Naval Base.
