



Biography

CJ Jaynes, is the executive technical adviser for Precision Landing Systems for Raytheon Intelligence, Information and Services (IIS). Raytheon Company (NYSE: RTN), with 2016 sales of \$24 billion and 63,000 employees worldwide, is a technology and innovation leader specializing in defense, civil government and cybersecurity solutions. Raytheon is headquartered in Waltham, Massachusetts.

IIS is a global leader in intelligence, surveillance and reconnaissance; advanced cyber solutions; weather and environmental solutions and information-based solutions. It provides training, logistics, engineering, product and operational services and solutions for special missions, homeland security, space, civil aviation, counter-proliferation, counterterrorism and cyber markets. Key customers include the U.S. and international governments across multiple departments and agencies, as well as commercial enterprises.

Jaynes joined IIS after a distinguished 33-year career in the U.S. Navy, retiring as rear admiral. Her last position was as program executive officer for Air Anti-Submarine Warfare, Assault and Special Mission Programs. She had oversight responsibility for 10 program offices and seven Acquisition Category I major programs with an annual budget authority of \$8 billion. Previous flag officer assignments included Naval Air Systems Command assistant commander for Logistics and Industrial Operations; and commander, Fleet Readiness Centers, responsible for seven centers globally engaged in aviation maintenance, repair and overhaul services for the Naval Aviation Enterprise.

Jaynes held command positions as program manager for Naval Air Traffic Management Systems (PMA 213) and Naval Aircrew Systems (PMA 202), and officer in charge,

Aircraft Intermediate Maintenance Detachment, Lemoore, California. Her fleet experience includes 15 years in operational squadrons and maintenance facilities around the globe.

Under Jaynes' command, PMA 202 won the 2007 NAVAIR Commander's National Award for Program Management. She was featured in Profiles in Diversity Journal as a 2013 Woman Worth Watching, and selected for the 2017 Distinguished Alumni Award from Indiana University of Pennsylvania. She is a member of Women in Defense; Women in Aviation International; U.S. Naval Institute; and Association of Naval Aviation. Jaynes is also a member of Indiana University of Pennsylvania's College of Natural Sciences and Mathematics Dean's Advancement Council serving as an adviser to the dean and an ambassador for the college.

She was commissioned via the Officer Candidate School in Newport, Rhode Island, and was designated an aeronautical engineering (maintenance) duty officer in 1985. She completed the Naval War College Command and Staff (nonresident) program and was designated an Acquisition Professional Community member in 1996. Jaynes earned a Systems Engineering Certification from California Institute of Technology Industrial Relations Center and attained four Level III Acquisition Certifications: Program Management; Systems Engineering; Production Quality and Manufacturing; and Acquisition Logistics.

Jaynes graduated from Indiana University of Pennsylvania with a Bachelor of Science in mathematics education and a master's in mathematics. She earned a Master of Business Administration from Norwich University.
